AAPT/METROLOGIC 2000 PHYSICS BOWL RESULTS

Dear Physics Teacher,

Thank you for having your students participate in this year's AAPT/Metrologic PHYSICS BOWL High School Physics Contest.

You have been provided with the core distributions, answer key, and list of top schools in each region. This was the second year that the tests have been batch-processed. It was particularly important that the students filled out the forms properly: including their names, the school's 9 digit identification (ZIP + four) code and the Division (1st or 2nd year) in which they were competing. Improperly filled out forms were grounds for disqualification. Well over 90% of the forms were properly filled out, but it is suggested that teachers look over the forms before they are returned. A school's score in a division is the sum of the four highest student scores on accurately completed forms.

The envelope contains the individual scores for each student who marked your school's 9 digit identification (ZIP+four) code. Several schools could not be identified with any school due to inadequate information on the forms. If you contact the EMAIL address below, an attempt will be made to provide scores for any missing students. Improperly filled out forms are not included in the team scores.

Over 6,800 students from nearly 400 schools participated in the 2000 PHYSICS BOWL competition. The top two schools in each of the 15 divisions will receive a plaque. Metrologic will also provide a \$1000 scholarship to each of the ten highest scoring students overall, \$300 scholarships to the highest scoring student in each region, and \$100 for each second-place student in each region. If your student has won a scholarship, it will be posted on two websites (http://www.AAPT.org or http://physics.unco.edu/physicsbowl). Several placings were decided by a tie-breaker. The entries were compared, from the end of the test forward, until the tie was resolved. The names of all winners have been forwarded to Metrologic, the sponsors of the examination. They will provide and distribute the prizes.

In order to determine a clear winner in a competition such as PHYSICS BOWL, the test must be moderately difficult so that the scores are not concentrated at the upper end of the scale. This year the test appeared to be significantly more difficult than in recent years. The distribution of scores is shown in the included graphs. Overall, the average was 15.09 with a standard deviation of 5.62. This was a bit lower than desired. We will strive to make the test a bit easier next year so as not to be too discouraging to students. The production of a test of only 40 questions that is appropriate for both first and second year students is an enormous task. Once again, AAPT and Metrologic would like to thank you for participating in this year's competition. We hope that you will enter your students in the 2001 PHYSICS BOWL next year.
